What does a Health Information Administrator do?

- Health Information Administrators supervise the medical records department, including appropriate storage, maintenance, and retrieval of information.

What kind of education would I need?

- High school diploma or equivalent
- Bachelor's degree in Health Information Administration
- Master's degree in Health Information Management Program is considered to be a standard
- One-year of residency in an approved hospital
- Pass an exam provided by the AHIMA

Where would I work?

- Hospitals
- Nursing homes
- Home health care agencies
- Clinics
- Public health agencies

Due to an increase in the number of tests, treatments, and procedures monitored by insurance companies Health Information Administrator positions is expected to grow much faster than average through the year 2014.
