


Dialysis Technician



What does a Dialysis Technician do?

- Dialysis Technicians set up and operate hemodialysis units and related equipment to provide dialysis treatment for patients with kidney disorders or failure.
- Dialysis Technicians uses advanced medical equipment to remove excess toxins and fluids from an individual's bloodstream.
- Dialysis Technicians will use dialysis procedures, assess patients throughout the dialysis process, provide support to dialysis patients and keep patient records.

What kind of Education would I need?

- High school diploma or equivalent
- Various community colleges, vocational schools, and training centers across the country offer programs leading to certification
- State certification is required
- Mechanical ability is also important in this job
